INSPIRED: *Renovations*

The Back Story:

Inspired by the original architect's fondness for French Farmhouse style, and by the Petit Hamlet at Versailles, we transformed a dilapidated shingled structure on this Greenwich property into a stone, stucco, and half-timbered French Normandy-style house.

The Elements:

A graduated slate roof adds scale and character while new French doors and casement windows of naturally finished oak complement the stucco- and half-timbered walls. The Connecticut granite base matches existing walls on the site.

The Challenges:

The eighty-year-old house's deteriorated state meant rebuilding much of the foundation, gutting the structure, and reconfiguring the interior space, all while adhering to zoning regulations. Re-imagining it as a French Country farmhouse transformed the building into a focal point of the property.
