Etched in Memory

When Greenwich, CT, one of the communities most impacted by 9/11, wanted to raise a monument to the town's residents killed that tragic day, the town turned to **CHARLES HILTON**, who has designed some of the area's most beautiful homes. The project was a departure for the architect, who was inspired by an exhibition of edge-lit glass sculptures he had seen in Venice. The memorial, which sits on a hillside in Cos Cob Park, features 12-foot-glass towers etched with an American flag motif and the names of the locals who lost their lives in the towers. Spiraling paths lead down the hill, and the surrounding meadow focuses the view toward the memorial and Indian Harbor beyond.
